

2012 CDYST Holiday Open Wrap-up

Zachary Doty of Nassau rolled an 846 four-game series to win his second Capital District Youth Scholarship Tour title in the 2012 CDYST Holiday Open held at Towne Bowling Academy on Thursday and Friday December 27th and 28th. There were 57 entries for this special event where bowlers could compete anytime during the tournament hours and re-enter as often as they would like.

Doty bowled early on Thursday and rolled a 719 four-game series in his initial entry. He immediately re-entered and rolled games of 203 and 201 before starting his third game with the first ten strikes for a 287. He completed his block with a 155 game to set a standard that enabled him to edge two other bowlers by fewer than 10 pins and earn a \$400 scholarship for his second victory of the season.

Midday on Friday, Christopher Hanson of Ballston Lake re-entered and started with games of 244, 210, and 211. In his final game, he needed to roll the first two strikes in the tenth frame to take the lead. He was successful on his first ball, but left a 10-pin on his second shot to come up one pin short and earn a \$225 scholarship for finishing second. Liz Kuhlkin of Schenectady finished third with a score of 837. Due to NCAA regulations, she could not accept her scholarship prize. Justin Carl finished fourth with 827 to earn a \$135 scholarship; Casey Schoonmaker of Albany finished fifth with 822 (\$100 scholarship). Zachery Porter of Schenectady finished sixth with 788 (\$75 scholarship); Amber Dominic finished seventh with 779 (\$60 scholarship); Kalynn Carl of Albany finished eighth with 764 (No prize due to NCAA regulations); Brandon Boyer of Hudson Falls finished ninth with 763 (\$50 scholarship); Thomas Marr of Schenectady finished tenth with 757 (\$45 scholarship); Ian Rose of Fort Edward finished eleventh with 756 (\$40 scholarship); Austin Van Buren finished twelfth with 745 (\$35 scholarship); Corey Buckley of Albany and Tyler Smith of Highland finished 13th and 14th with 737 and 735, respectively (\$30 scholarships).

Bowlers also had the option to simultaneously use their singles scores in tandem with other bowlers competing at the same time to form doubles teams. Doty and Schoonmaker topped 12 pairs with a combined score of 1652 to both earn \$120 scholarships. Justin and Kalynn Carl finished second with 1547. Justin earned a \$65 scholarship, while Kalynn could not accept her prize due to NCAA regulations. Boyer and Rose finished third with 1519 (\$35 scholarships).

Including prizes earned by nine bowlers from the optional clean game jackpot, \$1,973 in scholarships were awarded to our talented youth bowlers, raising the grand total to \$7,208 for the season. Total scholarship prizes awarded since our first event in May 2010 have now surpassed \$25,000.
