

2012 Sportsman's Bowl Tournament Wrap-up

Tournament leader Liz Kuhlkin of Schenectady defeated Corey Buckley of Albany 216 – 174 to win the Capital District Youth Scholarship Tour tournament held at Sportsman's Bowl on Saturday, December 15th.

The stepladder finals began with the fourth-seeded Buckley defeating third-seeded Kalynn Carl of Albany 215 – 193. Due to NCAA regulations, Carl could not claim her scholarship award for finishing fourth. Buckley then defeated the second-seeded Zachary Doty of Nassau 202 – 178 and set up the title match. Doty earned a \$175 scholarship for finishing third.

Kuhlkin began the championship match with an early double to take a 19-pin lead after three frames. Buckley followed with strikes in the fourth and fifth frames to close to within 12 pins, but Kuhlkin responded with four strikes in the next five frames to pull away and win her second CDYST title. Due to NCAA regulations, she could not claim her scholarship prize. Therefore, Buckley earned the \$325 top scholarship prize for finishing second.

In the extended six-game qualifying round, Carl surged to the early lead before Doty rolled a 260 in Game 6 to earn the top spot heading to the semifinals. He posted a 3 – 0 semifinal match play record, but Kuhlkin rolled a 715 three-game series, including a 279 in Game 9, to win her three matches and earn the top seed heading into the finals. Buckley also went undefeated to vault from 13th place to become the fourth seed.

In the fifth of ten 2012 – 2013 regular season tournaments there were 39 entries. Christopher Hanson of Ballston Lake and Patrick DeVoe of Delmar tied for fifth place and earned scholarships of \$102.50; Justin Carl of Albany earned a \$60 scholarship for finishing seventh; Michael Hartmann of Earlton won a \$50 scholarship for finishing eighth; Lawrence Lang of Rhinebeck won a \$40 scholarship for finishing ninth; Casey Schoonmaker of Albany and Zachery Porter of Schenectady earned \$35 scholarships for finishing tenth and eleventh, respectively. Our talented youth bowlers earned \$1,050 in scholarships, bringing the season total to \$5,235. Doty, Justin Carl, Hanson, and Chad Sutliff of Valatie earned entries into the 2013 USBC Junior Gold tournament to be held from July 13 – 19, 2013 in Detroit.

The next tournament is the 2012 CDYST Holiday Open, which will be held at Towne Bowling Academy on Thursday December 27th from 9 am – 3 pm and Friday December 28th from 9 am – 1 pm. Bowlers may start bowling at any time during the tournament hours and compete as often as they wish. \$750 will be added to the scholarship fund. Our next regular season tournament will be at 1:00 pm on Saturday January 5, 2013 at Alpha Lanes in Troy.
